

Burning in the Borough

Per section 20-104 of the Borough Code "It shall be unlawful for any person to burn any residential or multi-residential waste, leaf waste, or source-separated recyclable materials, excluding wood/coal stoves, charcoal pits and BBQ fires for pleasure."





SCHOOLS ARE OPEN! OUR BUS PATROL PROGRAM



The Dublin Borough Police Department, like all municipalities in the Pennridge School District, participates in the Bus Patrol program. This program utilizes video cameras around the bus which activate once the school bus stop arm is deployed. Suspected violations are then reviewed for potential prosecution by personnel from Bus Patrol and then forwarded to

the proper police department for further review and prosecution. Currently, most school buses in the district are equipped with the camera system and the program has been operational for about two years.

Violations processed through this program differ from violations processed as a criminal violation under Title 75 (the Vehicle Code). These are a civil process, and while they do come with a fine, they do not result in points on an offender's driver's license and cannot be used to increase insurance rates. The fine for the violation is \$300. Violations processed criminally carry a heavier penalty; specifically, a 60-day license suspension, 5 points on your driving record, and a \$250 fine. Regardless of the method of prosecution, the safety of our school students when entering and exiting their school bus is of the utmost importance and we remind all drivers to be alert for school buses loading and unloading children.

This program also provides us data as to when and where violations are occurring which allows us to post officers at those bus stops during the morning and afternoon hours. These officers prevent violations by their visibility and ticket directly when appropriate. One of the highest violation locations in the entire Pennridge School District is the 100 block of N. Main St. in Dublin Borough. For this reason, you will often see officers in that area during bus pickups and drop-offs. Here at the Dublin Borough Police Department, we take school bus violations very seriously.

Grass & Weed Maintenance

As a reminder, it is a violation of Borough Ordinance No 105 to permit grass or weeds to grow in excess of twelve inches. Please check your property and sidewalks regularly to ensure that you remain in compliance. Failure to comply shall give cause to Borough Authorities to have the same removed at a minimum cost of \$25.00 together with any additional penalty to be collected.

Leaf Disposal Reminder

As a reminder, do not blow or rake leaves into the street or roadway. Leaves can clog storm drains, cause flooding and create slippery road hazards for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians. Please bag your leaves and place them out for yard waste collection which is scheduled the last Saturday of the month. Contact Whitetail Disposal at (610) 936-9967 to be added to the collection list. Trees and Sidewalks


Per Ordinance 318, trees must be kept trimmed with no branches hanging over the roadway into the sidewalk and the vegetation upon the property along or near to any street in the Borough must be maintained.

Trash/Recycling Toters







A Message from our Emergency Management Coordinator Mike Tuttle



As the leaves begin to fall and the days grow shorter, autumn brings seasonal challenges that are important to keep in mind. Wet leaves can block storm drains and create slippery surfaces, while early sunsets can make roads more dangerous for drivers and pedestrians. Cooler evenings also mean it's time to check smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, prepare heating systems, and refresh household emergency kits. Taking small steps now—like cleaning gutters and safely storing firewood or heating fuels—can go a long way in preventing emergencies later in the season.

This time of year, also coincides with the peak of hurricane season and the potential for heavy rains or power outages. Borough emergency services remain ready to respond, but residents play an important role by staying alert to weather advisories and having a family plan in place. Whether it's preparing for storms, preventing fires, or simply checking in on neighbors as temperatures drop, a little preparation helps keep our community safe and resilient all season long.

A Message from our Tax Collector Susan Paff

Real estate tax bill for Dublin Borough & Bucks County (combined bill) is issued March 1 of each year. The bill is sent to the property owner. If you have a mortgage company or bank that escrows your real estate taxes, please forward a copy of the tax bill to them for payment. The Pennridge School District tax bill is issued July 1 of each year. The bill is sent to the property owner. If you have a mortgage company or bank that escrows your real estate taxes, please forward a copy of the tax bill to them for payment. If you do not receive your tax bill within 2 weeks of the issue date, please contact the Tax Office (email preferred) for a copy of the bill to be forwarded to you.



For your convenience, a drop box is available for tax payments. During hours when the Borough Office is open, a red drop box is available in the lobby for tax payments. During times when the Borough Office is closed a drop box for payments is available at the Office entrance. When submitting payment and requesting a receipt, please enclose your entire tax bill along with a self-addressed-stamped-envelope. The "Tax Payer" copy will be stamped with the paid date and returned to you.

Helpful Tips on Ambulance Billing from Point Pleasant Plumsteadville EMS Ambulance

Billing is often confusing, especially when it comes to insurance reimbursements. Most EMS agencies, including PPPEMS, are out-of-network providers, meaning we do not have contracts with insurance companies for lower, in-network rates. But here's the good news! You can often ask your insurance company to reimburse us at the correct out of network rate, not the lower in-network rate they may default to.

EXAMPLE:	In-Network	Out-of-Network
Ambulance Bill	\$1,500	\$1,500
Insurance Pays	\$300	\$900
You Pay	\$1,200	\$600

As the Recorder of Deeds, Dan McPhillips knows the purchase of your property is most likely the largest and most important purchase of a lifetime. To protect your investment, we encourage you to enroll in the Fraud Alert program. Once enrolled, the property owner will be alerted anytime a document has been recorded in the office against your name or parcel number. A cell phone or email address is needed to sign up for this program. We suggest you sign up by both name and parcel number for assurance. Should you receive an alert (text message or email), follow the instructions and contact our office immediately. If fraudulent activity occurs, our office will connect you with the District Attorney's office. We cannot emphasize enough the importance that you follow-up on any alert, never assume it was received in error. Our staff is available to help and dedicated to keeping your investment safe.



UTILITY PAYMENTS

PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

Please contact the Borough at {215) 249-3310 to confirm if a permit is required.

- **Building and/or Zoning Permit** required for any residential, commercial or industrial construction. Construction includes but is not limited to: new construction, additions, alterations, demolition, swimming pools and accessory structures. Accessory structures may include but are not limited to: storage sheds, detached garages, patios, decks; retaining.walls, barns, silos, above and in-ground pools, hot tubs, above-ground and in-ground storage tanks; fireplaces, etc.
- Zoning Permit required for signs; fences; home occupation registration, and other reasons.
- Moving Permit required when moving into, out of or within Dublin Borough.
- Park Permit required in order to reserve the pavilion at Supplee Park.
- Other permits may be required for certain activities.

It is the owners responsibility to ensure that applications submitted to the Borough are in compliance with any Homeowners Association Bylaws and/or Covenants.
